Weed treatments Gilpin County

Issued by: CSU Extension in Gilpin County

1. Overview

We are looking for bids for weed treatment in Gilpin County for two separate projects. County ROW treatment (not to exceed \$2,000, roads will be prioritized for treatment), and treating approximately 32 acres on a large private parcel for oxeye daisy, thistle and leafy spurge (treatment to be done mostly via boom spray, but may also involve a little use of a hand gun) – not to exceed \$5,100

2. Service/Requirements

The Contractor must:

- a. Be licensed and insured, and have a solid understanding of grazing restrictions and ROW legalities.
- b. Provide weed spray logs and GPS map of treated area.
- c. Communicate with landowners to work out timing of treatment on private parcel.
- d. Keep track of time and not exceed maximum specified amounts.
- e. Treat the areas sometime between the end of June and early August, most likely in early July for the acreage and later in July for the ROWs (times to be worked out between the Extension Agent and the Contractor).
- f. Illegal Aliens: As required by C.R.S. Section 8-17.5-102, the Contractor will need to certify the following: I (we) do hereby certify that, as of the date of this certification, I (we) do not knowingly employ or contract with an illegal alien and that I (we) have confirmed the employment eligibility of all employees who are newly hired for employment in the United States, through participation in the basic pilot program.

3. Submission Guidelines

Bid must include:

- a. Pricing for the full project – how many acres and linear miles of ROW can be treated for the specified amounts.
