- Speech Impairment, affecting your ability to communicate injury, illness, 911 phone calls, or ability to call/shout for help
- Cognitive Impairment, affecting your judgement in emergencies not only in recognition and avoidance of danger but in cooperation with emergency responders attempting to remove you from harms way.

Tips for evacuation preparedness

- Talk to your family and friends about evacuating. Plan where you will go. Plan a secondary place to evacuate to in case your primary location is not available.
- Have a bag ready with the most important items. Lists of phone numbers, your medications, financial information and family photo albums. Pack light, and only pack the essentials. In an evacuation, the most important item is YOU.
- In the event of an evacuation, do not waste time trying to turn off the utilities. The ultimate goal is to get you to safety.
- Don't delay your evacuation. Get to safety as soon as possible. Follow the instructions you receive when speaking to emergency responders, or through announcements you hear in your area.

Pre-Evacuation Assessment

After you return our registration form to Gilpin Ambulance Authoirty you will be contacted to set up a site review to pre-plan your evacuation. This time is crucial, as this is a chance for emergency responders to meet you and understand your needs.

During your interview, we will record some basic information about your specific needs for evacuation and address specific methods for quickly evacuating you and your loved ones. The local fire department will also have a representative present to inspect wild fire hazards around your home, and designate fire hazards that may increase the threat to you and your home.

Evacuation pre-plans will also include details to reasonably prepare to evacuate your service animal or companion pet during an emergency.
